LIAISON[®] Calprotectin

Calprotectin in faeces is a marker used to help differentiate IBS (Irritable Bowel Syndrome) from IBD (Inflammatory Bowel Disease) and assess disease activity in IBD.

Calprotectin is a heterocomplex composed of the calcium and zinc binding proteins S100A8 and S100A9. It is resistant to enzymatic degradation, and can be easily measured in faeces and therefore ideal for direct detection by immunochemistry methods.

LIAISON® Calprotectin is the perfect solution for achieving fast, reliable and automated results both for diagnosis and follow up of patients.

Method Comparison

A total of 117 stool samples were tested by the LIAISON® Calprotectin Assay and a commercial calprotectin assay. Results were analyzed relative to the respective assay cut-off values and are summarized in the table below.
